

## Preparation for planned inpatient admission to the Sankt Augustin Children's Hospital

Dear parents, dear patient,

an inpatient admission to the children's hospital is planned and it is our common aim to make this as safe and successful as possible. We ask all our patients and their parents to participate in the mutual protection.

Please follow the rules below:

- Stable patients should reduce the number of personal medical appointments and visits to the doctor's office 8 days before the planned inpatient admission to the paediatric clinic and continue their current medication.
- Patients and any accompanying person intended for admission as well as all persons living in the household should keep a diary for 8 days before the planned admission (see diary).
- In case of fever (temperature > 38°C) or signs of a respiratory infection (cough, cold, shortness of breath, sore throat) a throat swab for coronavirus should be taken.
- Patient and planned accompanying person should wear masks outside their home for 8 days before planned admission. Hands should be washed regularly.

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At admission to hospital, we ask you to answer the following questions:

Did the patient, the intended accompanying person or another person living in the household show signs of an respiratory infection in the last 8 days?
